Classical Vision for our Scholars

We follow the classical model of education, including grades six through twelve.

A low scholar to teacher ratio ensures individualized learning.

Physical copies of textbooks will be in the hands of every scholar.





Each individual scholar will show mastery of a topic before s/he moves on. If a scholar shows mastery quickly, s/he will move forward to continue to be challenged at whatever level s/he needs. If additional instruction is needed, it will be identified quickly and provided.

Individual Learning Plan (ILP) ~ Every scholar will have an ILP that is designed by the scholar / parents and counseling team. This ensures each scholar remains on track to meet graduation requirements.

Graduation Requirements ~ Seniors will complete an internship, finish a technical school certificate, and/or have an acceptance letter to college. We are preparing scholars to have a plan after high school.



Building and Facilities



Capstone Classical Academy was designed and built by local companies who understand the importance of the scholars' setting and surroundings.

Classrooms were designed based on the needs of the particular discipline or subject taught therein. An instructor can meet with a group of students to discuss a core concept and then break into smaller groups to apply and expand on those core concepts.





The blend of classical education with elements of the Finnish Model of education and hub-style learning is unique in Utah. This combination results in an environment where instructors are comfortable and respected and scholars are able to reach their full potential and have a plan for their future.

CCA Marketing Plan

The Board of Directors of Capstone Classical Academy recognizes that in order to meet the vision and mission it has set forth, it has the duty and responsibility to provide the resources and funding required to give CCA scholars what they need to excel. In Utah's system for funding education, this means we must bring in more scholars. To that end, the Board has developed the following strategic plan for appealing to and

enrolling new scholars:

Word of Mouth: We are confident that our best resources are the scholars who experience the CCA vision and the families who see them excel. To facilitate the spread of CCA's reputation, we plan to take the following actions:

- Hold events for scholars and encourage them to invite friends and neighbors.
- Encourage scholars to share their CCA experience with friends and neighbors.
- Under appropriate circumstances, reward scholars who bring potential new enrollees.
- Encourage scholars and their parents to share their experiences on social media, at church, at work, and elsewhere in the community.



Traditional Marketing: For those who are outside the CCA family sphere of influence, we hope to reach them through more traditional means, such as the following:

- Mailings & Door-to-door campaigns.
- Contacts at Hill Air Force Base for incoming military families.
- Billboards and flyers at local businesses.
- Stress the highlights of CCA: Classical Ed, Finnish Model, Hub learning, exciting STEM learning with Z-Space, "not-yet" theory of progressing.



CCA as a Community Hub: Our building should be considered a great asset this community and we hope it will be used as such. We believe that as more members of the community see what it has to offer, they will want to be a part of the CCA family. To help introduce them to CCA, we plan to do the following:

- Invite the public to open houses on a regular basis.
- Invite local businesses to hold networking events at CCA.
- Display the amazing artistic talents of our scholars by way of musicals, concerts, and exhibitions.
- Make CCA facilities available for others in the community to display their own talents.
